COMMUNITY ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

In all of our work, we must first acknowledge and be accountable to histories and ongoing processes of colonization and imperialism. In a country active in the continued colonial project, we must work in solidarity with and support the efforts on First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people and communities. Acknowledgements like these are only component Indigenous solidarity, and requires ongoing action, commitments to self-education, and support.

This DisOrientation Guide was conceptualized, researched, and created on the traditional and shared lands of Haudenosaunee, Anishinaabe, Wendat, and Chonnonton peoples. The Niagara region is also home to many Metis and Inuit people.

These lands are included in the Upper Canada Treaties and governed by the "Dish with One Spoon" pre-colonial agreement. This treaty between the Anishinaabe, Mississaugas and Haudenosaunee binds them to share the territory and protect the land. Subsequent Indigenous nations and peoples, settlers and all newcomers, have been invited into this treaty in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect. In learning about the treaties and agreements in this region, it is also integral to understand the 1764 Treaty of Niagara as a foundational agreement in nation-to-nation relations.

Legacies of colonization, racism, and capitalism are upheld everyday by our failure to address ongoing attacks on Two Spirit, trans, and gender non-conforming Black people, Indigenous people, People of Colour, who have always been at the forefront of calling for essential societal change, which this far too often ends up in their criminalization and deaths. In thinking about building creative spaces for societal change, we must be prioritizing these discussions and supporting the creative and political work of Indigenous and Black people and communities within Niagara, across this country, and across the world.

With so many resources available in Niagara and online, ignorance is not an option. We must to take action to do better.



USED SHARPS CONTAINER

What do you do if you find a needle in public?

There are a variety of reasons you might find a needle in public, & there is a very easy & safe way for you to dispose of it!

1. Find a container that is safe for sharps.

This would be ideally be a sharps container, but if you don't have one, any container that is resealable, puncture-proof, and is made of thick plastic/ metal (e.g. coffee can, water bottle, etc.).

2. Safely pick up the needle

You can do this using tongs or gloves, or only grabbing the barrel of the needle. Never grab it by the tip or try to recap the needle.

- **3. Put the needle TIP DOWN into the container**Make sure you cannot prick yourself in this process.
- 4. Label the container with marker if not already labelled.
- 5. Bring the container to a safe disposal site & their staff can permanently dispose of it.

Positive Living Niagara (120 Queenston St., St Catharines) is one of our key disposal sites. There are also many public disposal containers in locations like public washrooms. Advocating for more disposal bins in the region will help with the ease of disposing needles when you fund them.

Pro-tip - You can also support those impacted by the stigma around needing to use needles by sharing these steps with your communities and by getting trained in harm reduction & Naloxone.
