WHY HAVE A FREE STORE?

Having a store of free items helps us to challenge wasteful consumerism and present alternatives.

It allows people to get the things they need with fewer barriers.

The Free Store operates on the philosophy that there is more than enough to go around.



HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Free Store operates on donations. We gather useful items in good condition, and hold pop-up "stores" at local events in the region, where folks can come and take things they need or want.

We fulfill specific donation requests from community members when we can, and maintain an inventory of donations year-round.



WHY IS MUTUAL AID IMPORTANT?

Oppressive systems - such as capitalism - create the conditions for poverty to exist.

Under capitalism we are not guaranteed the basic necessities to survive. Mutual aid works to create networks of care to meet each of our immediate needs and build solidarity, while challenging the systems of oppression that got us here in the first place.

HOW IS THE FREE STORE MUTUAL AID?

Free Stores challenge capitalist scarcity myths tell us that there isn't enough to go around. It is a place where items can be donated by anyone and redistributed to everyone, with no conditions or proof of need. The Free Store shows us that there is more than enough for everyone, and scarcity discourse is harmful.
