### Public Libraries in Niagara

### Community Fridge Niagara - St. Catharines

- A network of grassroots fridges and pantries offering free food for and by neighbours in Niagara.
- **Notes:** No limits or restrictions, no requirements or proof of need necessary to take from the fridge.

### Rad Snax - St. Catharines

- **Notes:** Start Me Up Niagara sometimes works with the Niagara Regional Police Service (NRP), and partner with Niagara's Mobile Closet who have active partnerships with the NRP.

### Westview Centre 4 Women - St. Catharines

- Hot meals, support for women, drop-in services, workshops, hygiene supplies, warm clothing, laundry, other assistance.
- **Notes:** May require or request payment for some services, including accessing the food pantry.

- Clients can obtain a referral letter from Project SHARE to receive clothing items, including jackets and boots from Goodwill Industries or Shoulder-2-Shoulder.
- **Notes:** Identification, proof of need and income required to access some services.

### The Hope Centre - Welland

- Basic needs including food bank, emergency and transitional housing, counselling, legal clinic, medical help, clothing support, income tax clinic, food subsidy program.
- **Notes:** Requires you to bring necessary documentation and valid ID for some services. Some services require you to be a client. May need to have proof of Welland residency for some services.

### Farmworker HUB - Niagara-on-the-Lake



- 1570 Niagara Stone Road, Virgil, rear side door of Cornerstone Church Town Campus 905-483-9717
- Clothing, bikes, household supplies, and other essentials for migrant farmworkers.
- Workers can access the Hub on Sundays 2:00 - 5:00 pm.
